#### TURPENTINE AND TURPENTINE SUB-STITUTE CONTROL ORDER, 1918.

The Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers thereunto enabling him, hereby orders as follows:—

1. No person shall, on or after the 25th of January 1918, until further notice; purchase or take delivery of any Spirits of Turpentine or any Turpentine Substitute as hereinafter defined now or hereafter situated in the United Kingdom except under and in accordance with the terms of a license issued under the authority of the Minister of Munitions or of the Board of Admiralty, or of the Army Council, or sell, supply or deliver any such Spirits of Turpentine or Turpentine Substitute to any person other than the holder of such a license and in accordance with the terms thereof; provided that no such license shall be required by any person for the purchase and delivery of any such Spirits of Turpentine or Turpentine Substitute in quantities not exceeding an aggregate of five gallons during any one calendar month.

2. For the purposes of this Order the expression "Turpentine Substitute" shall mean Mineral Turpentine, White Spirit, White Oil, or any product of Petroleum under whatever name sold or known (except Motor Spirit and Benzine) capable of being used as a substitute for Spirits of Turpentine.

3. This Order may be cited as the Turpentine, &c., Control Order, 1918.

4. All applications for licenses under this Order shall be made to the Controller, Mineral Oil Production Department (M.P.S.), Ministry of Munitions, 8 Northumberland Avenue, W.C. 2.
