# IRISH CHANNEL-NORTH CHANNEL.

Restriction of Navigation.

Former Notice.—No. 126 of 1918; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force :-

1. Navigation and use of the undermentioned area is entirely prohibited to all ships and vessels of every size and nationality :-The area is bounded as follows:

On the North-West by a line joining (a) and (b):

(a) Lat. 55° 24½' N., Long. 6° 13¾' W. (b) ,, 55° 31' N., ,, 6° 02' W.

On the South-East by a line joining (c) and (d).

(c) Lat.  $55^{\circ}$   $13\frac{1}{2}'$  N., Long.  $5^{\circ}$  30' W. (d) ,,  $55^{\circ}$   $02\frac{1}{2}'$  N., ,,  $5^{\circ}$  40' W. On the South-West by a line joining (a) and (d)

On the North-East by a line joining (b) and (c).

2. Rathlin Sound is closed to all traffic.

Note.—This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

#### Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.

### ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

THE BOOT MANUFACTURERS (TRANSFER OF MACHINERY) ORDER, 1918.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council hereby order as follows :-

(1) No person, the business carried on by whom consists in the manufacture or repair of Boots or Shoes, shall, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Army Priority, sell or deliver to any other person any machinery or parts of machinery capable of being used for the manufacture or repair of Boots or Shoes.

(2) This Order may be cited as the Boot Manufacturers (Transfer of Machinery) Order, 1918.
