Scottish Office, Whitehall, March 16, 1918.

The King has been pleased, on the recommendation of the Secretary for Scotland, to appoint Mr. Dudley Stuart, Advocate, Sheriff-Substitute of Aberdeen, Kincardine, and Banff, to be a member of the Appeal Tribunal under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, for that Sheriffdom.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the

23rd day of May 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.
