

comply with any reasonable directions or regulations given or made with the object of enabling the same to be carried out. Provided that in no case shall any female person be searched by or in the presence of any one but a female person.

5. *Intoxication.*

No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain within the Depot.

6. *Saving of other Rules.*

Nothing in these rules shall affect any shop or other rules of or prescribed for the Depot, or the power to impose fines for the breach of such rules, subject to the provisions of the Truck Acts.

Any person failing to comply with the above rules will be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, and liable on summary conviction to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a period not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding £100 or both.

The Admiralty Rules dated the 12th of March 1917 are hereby cancelled.

REGISTRATION EXPENSES.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 15 of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, We, being Two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, have framed the following scales of Registration Expenses for Scotland. These scales will be applicable only to the first and second Registers prepared under the Act.

II.

PRINTING, &c., EXPENDITURE.

(1) Where the printing is carried out under arrangements made by His Majesty's Stationery Office such amount as may be certified by that Department to be the expenditure incurred in connection therewith.

(2) Printing carried out directly by the Registration Officer and other Out of Pocket Expenditure.

The actual expenditure supported as far as possible by vouchers and certified by a statutory declaration by the Registration Officer to the effect that it was necessarily and properly incurred. First class railway expenses and subsistence allowance at the rate of £1 a night when the Registration Officer is necessarily absent from home on account of his registration duties will be allowed.
