

Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Shirt-making Trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated the 26th December 1913,

Hereby give notice as required by Section 4 of the above Act that they Propose to Vary the Minimum Rates of Wages for female workers

fixed by them and set out in Schedule 1 of their Notice of the 11th March 1918, as follows, that is to say:—

- I.—(a) For female workers other than home-workers, from 5d. an hour to 6d. an hour.
(b) For female home-workers, from 5d. an hour to 6d. an hour.

For learners under 14 years of age, from 4/0 to 4/9 per week.

The above proposals are on the basis that the learners' rates are weekly rates based on a week of 50 hours, the rates being subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the worker in the factory or workshop in any week is less or more than 50.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within three months from the 1st July 1918. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Shirt-making Trade Board (Great Britain), 5 Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
