SPECIAL ACTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1915.

ERICHT WATER AND ELECTRIC POWER (EXTENSION OF TIME) ORDER, 1918.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 19 of the Ericht Water and Electric Power Act, 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1912"), as follows:—

"The powers of the Company for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of this Act shall cease after the expiration of three years from the commencement of this Act."

And whereas by the Ericht Water and Electric Power (Extension of Time) Order, 1916, made by the Secretary for Scotland in terms of the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, the powers of the Company under the said Section were extended for the period of one year from the 7th day of August 1915, and by the Ericht Water and Electric Power (Extension of Time) Order, 1917, were further extended for the period of one year from the 7th day of August 1916:

And whereas the Ericht Water and Electric Power Company (hereinafter called "the Company") have applied to the Secretary for Scotland for an Order in terms of the last-mentioned Act, further extending the time limited by the said Section:

And whereas I am satisfied that the time in respect of which the application is made should be extended :

Now therefore I, the Right Honourable Robert Munro, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the lastmentioned Act, hereby order as follows :---

1. This Order may be cited as the Ericht Water and Electric Power (Extension of Time) Order, 1918.

2. The powers of the Company under Section 19 of the Act of 1912 as extended by the Ericht Water and Electric Power (Extension of Time) Order, 1917, shall be further extended for the period of one year from the seventh day of August 1917, and the Act of 1912 shall have effect as if the time as extended by this Order were substituted for the time specified in the said Section.
