Notice is hereby given that the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, acting jointly with the Scottish Insurance Commissioners, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 15 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, and the said Joint Committee, acting alone, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by paragraph (F) of the First Schedule to the National Insurance Act, 1913, have made Regulations dated 28th June 1918.

These Regulations may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Benefits of Invalided Seamen

and Soldiers) Amendment Regulations (Scotland), 1918.

* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
