THE PETROLEUM PRODUCTS (WHOLESALE PRICES) NO. 3 ORDER, DATED THE 5TH DAY OF NOVEMBER 1918, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATIONS 2F AND 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade, deeming it expedient to make further exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2F and 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects Petroleum Products, hereby order as follows:—

1. The Schedule to the Petroleum Products (Wholesale Prices) No. 2 Order 1918 (S.R.O. 1918, No. 923) is hereby amended by substituting the sum of 3½d. per gallon for the sum of 2½d. per gallon as the additional charge that may be made for the delivery of both Gas Oil and Fuel Oil in barrels ex wharf.

2. This Order may be cited as The Petroleum Products (Wholesale Prices) No. 3 Order, 1918.

THE ROAD TRANSPORT (No. 3) ORDER, 1918, DATED 7TH NOVEMBER 1918, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATION 2JJJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them by Regulation 2JJJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Board of Trade hereby order as follows:—

1. Paragraphs 1, 2, and 3 of the Road Transport Order, 1918, may by notice be applied within any particular area specified in such notice to horse-drawn vehicles having a load capacity of less than 15 cwt. either as regards all such
