WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of May 1919, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas we are of opinion that the duties and responsibilities of Non-Commissioned Officers and Men belonging to the Royal Marine Garrison at Scapa in certain cases warrant the grant of additional remuneration :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with retrospective effect to cover payment in respect of duties already performed, the Rates of Allowances shown below, to be payable at our discretion to any men whose employment on the duties specified may be necessary :

“Whereas it is provided by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, that all pay and allowances in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such conditions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas Non-Commissioned Officers

and Men of the Royal Marines, who may be appointed as Gun Drill Battery Armourers in Royal Marine Divisions, are entitled under the present Regulations to receive allowances as follows :

“And whereas the improvements made in Naval Guns and Mountings and in Fire Control in recent years necessitate the employment of additional and more highly skilled artificers to ensure the efficient maintenance of Gun Drill Batteries in Royal Marine Divisions :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the payment of the following allowances, with effect as from the 6th May 1919, in lieu of those at present in force, to Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Marines employed on these duties :—
