**T**HIS day the Right Honourable Sir Francis Hyde Villiers, G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., C.B., having been appointed a Member of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the 18th day of August 1919, was, by His Majesty's command, sworn, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of August 1919, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas we consider it desirable to grant an allowance to certain daymen employed in connection with the Fire Control System in Your Majesty's Ships :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant, under the conditions set forth below, of a proficiency allowance of 3d. a day to Bandmasters and Band Corporals and to Regulating Branch (late Ship's Police) Schoolmaster, Writer and Victualling Ratings whilst employed on the more important duties in the fire control system, which call for special knowledge and ability,
