COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that, on the 4th November 1920, he made an Order under Section 61 of the

Coal Mines Act, 1911, entitled "The Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 4th November 1920." The effect of the Order is to extend to the 31st December 1921 the period during which the non-detonating explosives named and defined in the Second Schedule to the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 1st September 1913 are included in the term "permitted explosives."
