

any way connected with gas works, or with the supply or use of gas, or the manufacture, conversion, or sale of such residual products as they think fit; and to make and maintain on the said piece of ground all roads, ways, approaches, conducting pipes, appliances, and other conveniences necessary for the storage and distribution of gas and such residual products. The piece of ground hereinbefore mentioned is wholly situate in the Dundee Combination Parish, and City, and Royal Burgh of Dundee, and County of Forfar, and is as follows:—

All and whole that piece of ground extending to 82 poles or thereby lying on the south side of Foundry Lane and Seagate, in the Burgh of Dundee and County of Forfar, bounded, the said piece of ground, as follows, videlicet:—On the south, by ground belonging to James Keiller & Son, Ltd., along which it extends 127 feet or thereby; on the west, partly by East Whale Lane, along which it extends 176 feet or thereby, and partly by other ground belonging to James Keiller & Son, Ltd., along which it extends 32 feet or thereby; on the north, by Seagate and Foundry Lane, along which it extends 72 feet or thereby; and on the east, by ground belonging to the Commissioners, along which it extends 225 feet or thereby.

2. To empower the Commissioners by agreement to purchase, or acquire, or to feu, excamb, or take on lease additional lands for the purposes of their undertaking.

3. To authorise the Commissioners to lay down, take up, alter, remove, relay, and renew mains, pipes, and other apparatus for the supply of gas in streets and places, whether dedicated to the public use or not, and to lay down, take up, alter, remove, relay, and renew mains and pipes for the purposes of procuring, conducting, and disposing of tar, oil, and other materials used by them in or resulting from the manufacture of gas, and the residual products thereof, and to break up streets for such purposes.

4. To authorise the Commissioners to borrow money for the purposes of the Order, and of and in relation to their existing Acts or their gas undertaking, and to provide that the powers conferred on the Commissioners by the Dundee Gas Commissioners Order, 1910, in respect to the borrowing or raising of money, may apply to and be exercised for the purposes of the Order.

5. To authorise the Commissioners to assess, levy, and recover rates, rents, and charges for the supply of gas and residual products, and for the supply, hire, or use of meters, fittings, engines, and other articles and things supplied, and work done by the Commissioners, and to provide for the application thereof, and to alter gas rates, rents, and charges, and to confer, vary, and extinguish exemptions from the payment thereof.

6. To authorise and empower the Commissioners to enter into and carry out agreements with any person, Company, or Corporation for the sale, disposal, and excambion of any part of the gas lands and works of the Commissioners on such terms and conditions as the Commissioners may think fit, and to confirm any such agreement that has or may be entered into in reference thereto, or otherwise in reference to the gas undertaking or the purposes of the Order.

7. To confer upon the Commissioners all other powers, rights, privileges, and authorities necessary or desirable for effecting the objects and

purposes comprised in this Notice, and to be comprised in the Order; and to repeal, vary, or extinguish all rights, powers, authorities, jurisdictions, privileges, and exemptions inconsistent with, or which would or might in any way interfere with, any of the objects and purposes aforesaid, or with the Order; and to confer, vary, and extinguish other rights, powers, authorities, jurisdictions, privileges, and exemptions.

8. To incorporate with, and extend and apply to, the Order the clauses and provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, and the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871, or some part or parts thereof respectively, with or without such modifications and variations as may be necessary.

9. To vary, amend, alter, or repeal, and also to extend or enlarge, so far as may be necessary for the purposes of the Order, all or any of the provisions of the following Acts, or some or one of them, or some parts or portions thereof respectively (that is to say)—The Dundee Gas Acts, 1868 to 1914, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Commissioners, or to the Gas Undertaking of the Commissioners.

The subsequent procedure will be by way of Provisional Order, unless it is otherwise decided in forms of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act, 1899, in which case the procedure may be by way of Private Bill; and if the subsequent procedure shall be by way of Private Bill, this Notice and the deposits with reference to the said intended application will, subject to the Standing Orders of Parliament, apply to such Bill.

The Petition for the Order and the Draft Order, and printed copies thereof respectively, will be lodged on or before the 17th day of December next in the Office of the Secretary for Scotland, Whitehall, London, and on or before the same date a printed copy of the Draft Order will be deposited in the Office of the Clerk of the Parliaments and in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
