PATENTS FOR INVENTIONS.

THE PATENTS (TREATIES OF PEACE—AUSTRIA
AND BULGARIA) RULES, 1920, DATED 29TH
NOVEMBER 1920.

By virtue of the provisions of the Trading
with the Enemy Acts, 1914 to 1918, the
Treaties of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act,
1920 (a), the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order,
1920 (b), the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order,
1920 (c), and the Order of the Board of Trade,
dated 9th November 1920 (d), the Board of
Trade do hereby make the following Rules :—

Short Title and Commencement.

1. These Rules may be cited as the Patents
(Treaties of Peace—Austria and Bulgaria)
Rules, 1920, and shall come into operation
from and immediately after the 29th day of
November 1920.

Application of the Patents (Treaty of Peace) Rules 1920 (e).

2. All applications and proceedings under the
Order of the Board of Trade, dated the 9th day
of November 1920, shall be made in accordance
with, and be regulated by, Rules 3 to 12 in-
clusive, and the First and Second Schedules
of the Patents (Treaty of Peace) Rules, 1920,
which shall accordingly apply as if they were
herein repeated. For the purposes of these
Rules any words used in the said Patents
(Treaty of Peace) Rules, 1920, the meanings
of which are defined in the Order of the Board
of Trade dated the 9th day of November 1920,
shall have the meanings assigned to them by the
said Order.

* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the local inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
