ORDER BY THE SECRETARY FOR SCOTLAND UNDER SECTION 71 (6) OF THE EDINBURGH BOUNDARIES EXTENSION AND TRAMWAYS ACT, 1920,\* TRANSFERRING CERTAIN OFFICERS AND SERVANTS OF EDUCATION AUTHORITIES TO THE EDINBURGH EDUCATION AUTHORITY.

Whereas by the Edinburgh Boundaries Extension and Tramways Act, 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1920," the boundaries of the City and Royal Burgh of Edinburgh were extended by the inclusion therein inter alia of part of the area of the County of Midlothian, hereinafter referred to as "the transferred area":

And whereas the City as so extended forms an education area under the provisions of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1918,† and an education authority, hereinafter called "the education authority," has been constituted and elected for such area and comes into office on the 15th day of May 1921:

And whereas it is provided inter alia by Section 71 (6) of the Act of 1920 that the Secretary for Scotland may by Order make provision for the transfer of the officers and servants of the existing education authorities (so far as not in the Act of 1920 specifically provided for) to the education authority:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Robert Munro, His Majesty's Secretary for Syotland, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. All officers and servants of the existing

Edinburgh Education Authority, and all officers and servants of the Midlothian Education Authority employed exclusively in or in connection with the schools in the transferred area, shall be transferred to and become officers and servants in the service of the Education Authority.

2. This Order may be cited as the Edinburgh Education Authority (Transfer of Officers) Order, 1921, and shall come into operation on the 15th day of May 1921.
