And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 17th May 1921, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by the Trade Board, and specifying 23rd May 1921* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.
