

But excluding—

- (1) Those branches of women's or girls' Bespoke Tailoring and all operations or processes covered by the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919.
- (2) The making of headgear;
- (3) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;
- (4) Warehousing, packing, and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to Workers earning Higher Rates of Wages, or to Agreements made, or that may be made, between Employers and Workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

FRIENDLY SOCIETIES, ETC., ADVERTISEMENTS IN THE EDINBURGH GAZETTE —INCREASED CHARGES.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have made the following Provisional Regulations dated 30th April 1921, under the Industrial and Provident Societies Act, 1893, the Friendly Societies Act, 1896, and the Collecting Societies and Industrial Assurance Companies Act, 1896.

In pursuance of the powers vested in the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury by the above-mentioned statutes, Their Lordships have made and approved of the following Regulations amending the Treasury Regulations dated 1st January 1894 and 1st January 1897:

1. The sum of 5s. 6d. which is directed by Regulations 6 and 38 of the Treasury Regulations dated 1st January 1894, under the Industrial and Provident Societies Act, 1893, and the like sum which is directed by Regulations 53, 60, and 65 of the Treasury Regulations dated 1st January 1897, under the Friendly Societies Act, 1896, and the Collecting Societies and Industrial Assurance Companies Act, 1896, to be paid to the Chief Registrar of Friendly Societies in respect of the publication of certain matters in the Edinburgh Gazette, shall, as from 1st May 1921, be increased to the sum of 7s. 6d., and the Regulations above mentioned shall, as from the last-mentioned date, be deemed to be amended accordingly.

2. It is hereby certified that, on account of

urgency these Regulations should come into immediate operation, and these Regulations are hereby made to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Regulations in accordance with Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

**KILMARNOCK ELECTRICITY
(EXTENSION).**

(Extension of Limits of Corporation for Supply of Electricity; Revocation of Premises Order; Amendment of Orders, &c.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application has been made by the Provost Magistrates and Councillors of the Burgh of Kilmarnock (hereinafter called "the Corporation") and whose address is the Council Chambers Kilmarnock to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1919 for the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of supply within which the Corporation are under the Kilmarnock Electric Lighting Orders 1899 and 1914 (hereinafter called "the Orders of 1899 and 1914") authorised to supply electricity so as to include therein:—

- (1) The municipal burghs of Ardrossan Saltcoats Kilwinning Stewarton and Cumnock
- (2) the parishes of Beith Dunlop and Stewarton and (3) so much of the parishes of Ardrossan West Kilbride Dalry Kilbirnie Muirkirk Auchinleck Stair Old Cumnock Ochiltree Coylton Tarbolton Monkton and Prestwick Stevenston Irvine Kilwinning Dreghorn Fenwick Loudoun Galston Sorn Mauchline Craigie and Symington as are beyond the area of supply authorised by the Kilmarnock Electric Lighting Order 1914 and lie within an imaginary line commencing at a point at high water mark of ordinary spring tides on the foreshore of the Firth of Clyde where the boundary of the parish of Ardrossan adjoins the boundary of the parish of West Kilbride and drawn thence in a north easterly direction for a distance of eleven miles or thereabouts to the boundary of the Counties of Ayr and Renfrew at a point known as Ladyland Bridge thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction along the said boundary to the junction of the boundaries of the Counties of Ayr Lanark and Renfrew near Loudoun Water thence in a southerly easterly and south-easterly direction along the boundary of the Counties of Lanark and Ayr to a point where that boundary crosses the Glasgow and South Western Railway (Douglas and Muirkirk Extension) at Glenbuck Loch thence in a westerly south-westerly and north-westerly direction along the southern boundary of the Glasgow and South Western Railway (Muirkirk Branch and the Ayr and Cumnock Branch) to a point where the boundary of the parish of Tarbolton crosses the Glasgow and South Western Railway (Ayr and Mauchline Branch) near Annbank Station thence in a north-westerly direction along the boun-
