WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of December 1922 (N. 12192), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, wages, pen-

sions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas We have had under consideration the promulgation of certain Regulations for the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve :

"And whereas certain of those Regulations relate to pay, wages, bounty money or allowances in the nature thereof payable to members of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve in respect of services in Your Majesty's Navy :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction such of the aforesaid Regulations as relate to pay, wages, bounty money, or allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Navy.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal, dated the 21st November 1922, to appoint Thomas Henry, Marquess of Bath, K.G., C.B., to be Master of His Majesty's Horses during His Majesty's Pleasure.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

CIVIL SERVICE.

Regulations, dated the thirtieth day of November 1922, made by the Treasury under Article 6 of the Order in Council, dated the 22nd July 1920, with respect to the sick leave pay to be allowed under Article 3 of the Order in Council, dated the 22nd March 1918, to officers holding Modified (War) Certificates.

In pursuance of Article 6 of the said Order of 22nd July 1920, the Treasury hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. The Order of 22nd March 1918 shall have effect as though the following were substituted for the first paragraph of Article 3 thereof:—

“ In the application to the case of officers holding Modified (War) Certificates of the sick leave rules laid down in Clause 19 of the principal Order the following modification shall be made, that for the first five years of service after the date of the certificate any civil pay allowed during sick leave in excess of three months in the aggregate in any year shall be reduced to such amount as with any pension or retired pay and allowances payable by the Ministry of Pensions in respect of the

period of sick leave, will not exceed the full civil pay of the office in respect of that period.”

2. These Regulations shall come into force on the first day of November 1922.
