association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;

(f) The minting of coinage of the realm;

(g) The process of hand-embossing.

### PART V.

Section I.—The above Minimum Rates of wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Section II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of Orders of the Minister of Labour dated 29th May 1922 and 18th December 1922, confirming the variations of minimum rates of wages made by the Trade Board and set out above, and specifying the dates shown in this Notice as the dates from which they should become effective.

## Extension of Period Prescribed as Double Dipping.

The dates between which all sheep in the Double Dipping Area, described in the Schedule hereto, are to be dipped twice within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II. of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, are hereby fixed to be the fourteenth day of November nineteen hundred and twenty-two, and the eleventh day of January nineteen hundred and twenty-three, instead of the fourteenth day of November nineteen hundred and twenty-two,

and the first day of January nineteen hundred and twenty-three, as prescribed by Article 3 of the Order of the Minister (No. 1200), dated the tenth day of November nineteen hundred and twenty-two.
