REDUCTION OF CAPITAL.

IN the Petition presented to the Second Division of the Court of Session by the Linkwood-Glenlivet Distillery Limited, incorporated under the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1890, and having their Registered Office at 90 High Street, Elgin, for Confirmation of Reduction of Share Capital, the following Interlocutor was pronounced on 9th January 1923, namely:—

“*Edinburgh, 9th January 1923.*—The Lords having resumed consideration of the Petition and proceedings along with the Report by J. Douglas H. Dickson, Esq., W.S., No. 56 of Process, approve of said Report; settle the List of Creditors entitled to object to the proposed reduction of share capital; find that the consent of every Creditor entitled to object to the reduction has been obtained, or that the debts or claims of Creditors not consenting have been discharged or have been secured; confirm the reduction of share capital resolved on by the Special Resolution of the Company passed at their Extraordinary General Meeting held on 14th October 1922, and confirmed on 3rd November 1922, as set forth in the Petition; approve of the Minute set forth in the Petition; direct registration of said Minute and of this Order by the Registrar of Joint Stock Companies, and on said Minute and Order being so registered direct advertisement thereof to be made once in the *Edinburgh Gazette* and once in each of the *Scotsman* and *Elgin Courant* newspapers; dispense altogether with the addition to the name of the Company of the words ‘and Reduced,’ and decern.
