

invaliding was due to injuries attributable to the Service, when that course would be more advantageous to them than an augmentation under the provisions of Your Majesty's Order in Council of 13th August 1920. Provided always that the conditions and restrictions governing increases under the latter Order in Council shall be applicable in their entirety to the awards for which authority is now sought, and that the disablement element shall be that appropriate to the present degree of disability as determined by medical survey, if a medical examination be deemed necessary.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
