##### *Re-opening of Landing Place at Glasgow for Fat Stock.*

1. Article 2 (f) of the Renfrewshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 6) is hereby revoked and the following Article is substituted therefor:—

(f) The landing of animals at the Approved Landing Place and Imported Animals Wharf at the Port of Glasgow (Merklands) is hereby prohibited; except for the purpose of slaughter within the Landing Place or Wharf within 96 hours of the time of landing.

##### *Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of December nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

##### *Extension of Certain Infected Areas.*

1. The Great Britain (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 5) hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order" and any Order amending that Order shall be read and have effect as if the Areas Nos. 1 and 2, described in the Schedule to this Order were included in and formed part of the Infected Area No. 6, described in the First Schedule to the Principal Order, and the Area No. 3, described in the Schedule hereto were included in and formed part of the Infected Area No. 1, described in the First Schedule to the Principal Order. These Areas shall thereupon cease to form part of the Controlled Area.

##### *Short Title.*

2. This Order may be cited as the GREAT BRITAIN (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 7) and shall be read with the Principal Order.
