INDIAN CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATIONS.

In conformity with the provisions of the Statute 56 and 57 Victoria, Charter 66, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for India in Council proposes with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, at the expiration of 40 days from the date of this Gazette to make, under Section 97 (1) and (2) of the Government of India Act, changes as indicated below in the Regulations for the examination in London of candidates for admission to the Indian Civil Service.

For Rule 16, which at present is as follows:—

“ 16. Persons desirous to be admitted as Candidates must apply on Forms, which may be obtained from ‘The Secretary, Civil Service Commission, 6 Burlington Gardens, London, W.1,’ at any time after the 1st December, in the year previous to that in which the Examination is to be held. No person will be admitted to the Examination from whom the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners has not received on or before the 1st June (or, if that date should fall on a Sunday or public holiday, then, on or before the first day thereafter on which their office is open), in the year in which the Examination is to be held, an application, in the handwriting of the Candidate, on the prescribed form.”

it is proposed to substitute the following:—

“ 16. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made in the handwriting of the Candidate, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.”

It is intended that the amended regulations shall apply to candidates at the open competitive examination to be held in London in the year 1925.
