WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of December 1924 (N. 5017/24), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Section B of the Schedule attached to Your Order in Council of the 11th day of October 1921, and by Order in Council of the 20th day of June 1922, non-substantive pay is payable continuously to Sick Berth ratings qualified as Operating Room, Laboratory, or X-Ray Assistants, or as Masseurs, provided, *inter alia*, that arrangements are made for such men to be regularly employed on their specialist duty:

“And whereas these ratings are retained on separate rosters for drafting purposes so as to

be employed to the maximum on their special duties:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to continue payment of the said non-substantive pay to qualified Sick Berth ratings when the exigencies of Your Majesty's Naval Service require that they shall serve in Ships or Naval Establishments in which they cannot be regularly employed on their specialist duties.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the

Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of December 1924 (N. 5077/24), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council dated the 21st December 1920, it is provided that a rating employed as Captain's Writer in destroyers which are independent commands may be paid an allowance of 6d. a day:

“And whereas we consider it desirable that this allowance should also be payable in submarines of the larger classes:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize payment at our discretion as from the 19th November 1924, of an allowance of 6d. a day to one rating of the crew of each of the larger submarines when required to act as Captain's Writer.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 5th day of December 1924 (C. (3) 10586/1924), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, or to the widow or relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Section 2 of the Officers of Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty may enrol Officers of the Reserve to the Royal Navy under, and subject to, such Rules, Orders, and Regulations

as the Admiralty may, with the consent of Your Majesty in Council, from time to time establish:

“And whereas under the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1920, provision was made subject to certain conditions and restrictions for the increase of certain pensions granted before the 4th day of August 1914, and, subject to certain further limitations, for the increase of similar pensions granted subsequently to that date to certain pensioners therein referred to:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of August 1920, to empower us, subject to like conditions and restrictions, to grant increases of retired pay or pension to:

(a) Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Force;

(b) The Widows of such Officers and Men;

(c) Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service, and Nursing Service Reserve;

(d) Riggers and Yardcraft men pensionable under Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 2nd day of June 1915, and previous Orders;

(e) Teachers in the Girls' and Infants' Schools of Your Majesty's Royal Marine Force who are pensionable under Orders in Council dated the 18th day of May 1897 and the 10th day of February 1905;

who were retired or pensioned before the 4th day of August 1914, as well as to certain of them who have been granted retired pay or pension subsequently, but with effect from a date not later than the 13th day of August 1920:

“And whereas by the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1924, provision has been made subject to certain conditions and restrictions therein specified for raising the percentages by which the pensions to which the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1920, applies may be increased, and further for extending, as from 7th August 1924, the provisions of the said Act to pensioners residing outside the British Islands:

“And whereas the increases laid down in the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1924, have effect from the 1st day of July 1923:

“And whereas we are of opinion that subject to like conditions and restrictions we should be empowered to raise the percentages by which the retired pay and pensions to which Your Majesty's Order in Council dated the 13th day of August 1920, applies may be increased and further to extend the provisions of that Order to pensioners residing outside the British Islands:

“And whereas we are further of opinion that the revised percentages as in the case of the pensions to which the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1924, applies should have effect from the 1st day of July 1923:

“And whereas we are of opinion that Clause (b) of Rule 4 of the Regulations approved by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of August 1920, should be amended so as to conform more closely with the corresponding provision in Part I. of the Schedule to the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1920, and that Rule 9 of the Regulations sanctioned by Your Majesty's Order in Council aforesaid should be amended so as to conform with the corresponding Regu-

lation laid down in the Royal Warrant for the pay of the Army:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to cancel Clause (b) of Rule 4 and Rule 9 of the Regulations sanctioned by Your Order in Council dated the 13th day of August 1920, without prejudice, however, to the validity of any action that may have been taken thereunder prior to the date of this Order and to approve, without prejudice to the rights of any pensioner under the Order in Council aforesaid, the Regulations in the Schedule annexed hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

"SCHEDULE.

"REGULATIONS REGARDING THE INCREASE OF PENSIONS.

"Limitations on the amount of increase of pensions.

"(1) Subject to the conditions, restrictions and limitations prescribed in the Regulations sanctioned by the Order in Council dated the 13th day of August 1920, as amended in Rule (2) hereunder:—

"(a) When the existing pension does not exceed £25 a year.	{ It may be increased by 70%.
--	-------------------------------

When the existing pension exceeds £25 a year, but does not exceed £50 a year.	{ It may be increased by 65%.
---	-------------------------------

When the existing pension exceeds £50, but does not exceed £100 a year.	{ It may be increased by 50%.
---	-------------------------------

"Provided that no pension shall be increased by virtue of the increased percentages authorised by this rule:—

"(1) In the case of a pensioner other than a Rigger or a Yardcraft man by an amount greater than may be sufficient to make the increased pension equal to the pension of which such pensioner would from time to time have been in receipt had the pension been awarded on the 1st day of July 1923, in respect of the same rank or rating, the same age and the same period of service as premised in the actual award.

"(2) In the case of a Rigger or Yardcraft man by an amount greater than may be sufficient to increase his pension to the pension of which he would have been in receipt on the 2nd day of July 1923 had the additional remuneration by way of bonus payable on the 1st day of July 1923 been included amongst the salary and emoluments on which his pension was awarded in lieu of the bonus, if any, which was actually so included.

"(b) For the purpose of this Rule 'existing pension' means a pension granted with effect from a date not later than the 13th day of August 1920.

"(2) The Regulations sanctioned by the Order in Council dated the 13th day of August 1920 shall be amended as follows:—

"(a) The condition laid down in Clause (a) of Rule 3 that the pensioner must reside

in the British Islands shall cease to have effect as from the 7th day of August 1924, and shall be cancelled accordingly.

"(b) The Regulations shall be read as though Clause (b) of Rule 4 were cancelled and a fresh Rule 5A substituted in lieu thereof in the following terms:—

"5A. The following further limitations shall apply to Naval Pensioners in receipt of more than one pension.

"When a Naval pensioner is in receipt of a pension to which these Regulations apply and also in receipt of another or other pensions the pension to which these Regulations apply shall for the purposes of Rules (4) and (5) be deemed to be one pension of an amount equal to the aggregate amount of the said pensions, subject to the proviso that the Admiralty in determining the percentage increase permissible under Rule (4) in respect of the pension to which these Regulations apply, may ignore any other pension which

"(i) Although no larger than a pre-war pension cannot be increased either under the Pensions Increase Acts, 1920 and 1924, or under these Regulations or under any Order in Council or Royal Warrant or other Regulations providing for the grant of corresponding benefits, or

"(ii) is of a type to which none of the Acts, Orders in Council, Royal Warrants or Regulations aforesaid applies.

"(c) For the purposes of this Order in Council and of the Order in Council of 13th August 1920 already referred to, an age pension or an increased age pension granted to a Seaman or Marine Pensioner on attaining 55 or 65 years of age respectively shall be treated as part of his original pension.

"(d) Rule 5b shall be cancelled and the following substituted:—

"5 (b). No pension granted with effect from a date later than the 3rd day of August 1914 shall be increased under these Regulations by an amount greater than is sufficient to make the increased pension equal to the amount which might be granted under existing Regulations, or any amended Regulations which may be promulgated with effect from a date not later than the 1st day of October 1921.

"(e) Rule 9 shall be cancelled and the following substituted:—

"(i) These Regulations shall not apply to any pension, the total amount of which has been commuted.

"(ii) Any pension of which a part has been commuted since the 13th August 1920, or may hereafter be commuted, shall be deemed to be a pension of the amount in issue at the above date for all purposes connected with these Regulations, provided that in calculating the total means of the pensioner and in determining the amount of pension upon which an increase may be granted the commuted portion of the pension shall not as such be taken into account.

"(iii) An increase of pension granted under these Regulations shall not be commuted in whole or in part.

"(3) These Regulations shall except as hereinafore mentioned have effect from the 1st day of July 1923, and shall be incorporated with, and read as part of, the Regulations sanctioned by the Order in Council dated the 13th day of August 1920, as amended by Rule (2) above."

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 19th December 1924, at 1 o'clock, for:—

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £40,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £4,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 22nd December 1924 to Saturday the 27th December 1924 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny), which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1000, and £5000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 30th September 1924, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 22nd December 1924 to Saturday the 27th December 1924 inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th April 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR SITUATIONS IN THE DEPARTMENTAL CLERICAL CLASS (WOMEN) OF THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 20; candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination. A candidate who attained the age of 18 on the first day of the examination would be admitted, but a candidate who attained the age of 20 on that day would not be admitted.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowance will be made:—

Persons who have served in any

established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil station to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

3. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

4. Candidates will be required to take up duty in such place in Great Britain as the Minister of Labour may determine.

5. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character, and must be unmarried or widows.

6. The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows:—

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate number of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made in the writing of the candidate, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. A fee of £2 will be required from each candidate attending an examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 19th March 1925. The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the examination may be held:—Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Edinburgh, Leeds, London, Manchester, Northampton and Preston. The final list of centres will be decided when the number of candidates desiring examination at each centre is known.

Not fewer than 300 candidates will be appointed on the result of this examination, if so many should be found to be duly qualified.

THE ORKNEY (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1924.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1) The Local Authority of the District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

6. This Order may be cited as the ORKNEY
(CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1924.
