FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the lifting by hand of heavy weights (materials, tools or appliances) in the manufacture, dyeing or finishing of woollen or worsted textiles, or in any process ancillary or incidental thereto, to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make Regulations fixing the maximum weights to be lifted by any person employed in such processes. The Regulations will apply to all factories and workshops or parts thereof in which such processes are carried on.

Copies of the Regulations proposed to be made may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, London, S.W. 1.

Objections to the draft Regulations, by or on behalf of any persons affected by the Regulations, must be sent to the Secretary of State, Home Office, London, S.W. 1, within 30 days from the date of this notice. Every such objection must be in writing and must state (a) the draft Regulations or portions of draft Regulations objected to; (b) the specific grounds of objection; and (c) the omissions, additions, or modifications asked for.
