## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 29th May 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) 4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £40,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £4,000,000 but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

### TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday the 2nd June 1925 to Saturday the 6th June 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

(being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

### 4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1000, and £5000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 31st March 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the prospectus of the 23rd March 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday the 2nd June 1925 to Saturday the 6th June 1925, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
