COUNTY COUNCIL ELECTORAL
DIVISIONS OF AYRSHIRE.

ORDER BY THE SECRETARY FOR
SCOTLAND.

Whereas the Contents and Boundaries of the Electoral Divisions of Glengarnock and Kilbirnie, in the County of Ayr, were determined by an Order under the hand and seal of the Secretary for Scotland, dated the 10th February 1910:

And whereas the County Council of the County of Ayr have represented to me that it is

desirable to alter the Names and Contents of the said Electoral Divisions of Glengarnock and Kilbirnie:

And whereas I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the representation of the said County Council:

Now therefore, I, the undersigned, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, in virtue of the powers conferred on me by Section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, do hereby order as follows:—

The Order of the Secretary for Scotland, dated the 10th February 1910, is hereby recalled in so far as concerns the Electoral Divisions of Glengarnock and Kilbirnie, and from and after the date hereof the Names and Contents of the said Electoral Divisions shall be as follows:—

Name of Division.	Contents of Division.
Kilbirnie East.	The area within a line beginning at the boundary of the Parish of Dalry and Kilbirnie at the Hagsthorn proceeding along the main Dalry Road to the Parish Church, thence along the Kilbirnie and Glengarnock Road in a Southerly direction to the Railway Bridge which crosses the main road at the Cemetery Cottage, thence along the Railway Line (North Johnstone Branch) in a Northerly direction to the boundary of the Parish, thence Easterly, Southerly and Westerly along the boundary line which divides the Parish of Kilbirnie and the Parishes of Lochwinnoch, Beith and Dalry to the point of starting. All within the Parish of Kilbirnie and County of Ayr.
Kilbirnie West.	The remainder of the Parish of Kilbirnie.
