WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 11th day of June 1925 (N.P. (1) 1725/25), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, or to the Widow or relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Section 2 of the Officers of Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty may enrol Officers of the Reserves to the Royal Navy under, and subject to, such Rules, Orders and Regulations as the Admiralty may, with the

consent of Your Majesty in Council, from time to time establish:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 8th day of December 1924 to sanction certain Regulations regarding the increase of pensions to certain pensioners therein specified under conditions corresponding generally to those laid down in the Pensions (Increase) Acts, 1920 and 1924:

"And whereas we have been advised that the Regulation laid down in Clause 2 (b) of the Schedule to Your Majesty's Order aforesaid respecting Naval Pensioners in receipt of more than one pension is more stringent than are the corresponding provisions of the Pensions (Increase) Acts, 1920 and 1924:

"And whereas we are of opinion that Naval pensioners in receipt of more than one pension should not be at a disadvantage as compared with the Civil Pensioners in receipt of more than one pension:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to cancel Clause 2 (b) of the Regulations appearing in Your Order aforesaid and to direct that those Regulations shall be read as though that Clause had never appeared therein.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of June 1925 (C.W./G.H. 25187/25), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that the Admiralty may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of Officers appointed for the service of Greenwich Hospital:

"And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is further enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas Mr. William Harold Dimsdale, Commissioned Gunner on the Retired List of Your Majesty's Fleet, has performed the duties of Chief Officer of the Royal

Hospital School, Greenwich, for over eight years, and has resigned his appointment owing to impaired health, his resignation having effect from the 1st day of June 1925:

"And whereas this Officer is ineligible by service under the regulations for advancement on the Retired List on vacating the above-mentioned appointment, and the appointment does not confer any claim to pension or gratuity:

"And whereas we are of opinion that his meritorious service under the Department of Greenwich Hospital is deserving of special recognition:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the advancement of the said Mr. William Harold Dimsdale to the rank of Lieutenant on the Retired List of Your Majesty's Fleet, as from the 1st day of June 1925, and the payment to him of a gratuity of £75 from the funds of Greenwich Hospital.

"Provided that such advancement on the Retired List shall be regarded as entirely of an honorary nature and shall not confer any title to increased benefits from Naval Funds either on him or his dependants."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, power is given to His Majesty by Order in Council to make Regulations with respect to the manner in which Government ships may be registered as British ships for the purpose of the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas by the said Section it is provided that those Acts shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications which may be made by Order in Council, either generally or as respects any special class of Government ships, apply to Government ships registered in accordance with such Regulations as if they were registered in manner provided by those Acts:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act, or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following Regulations shall have effect as regards any Government ships in the service of the Govern-

ment of the Colony of the Falkland Islands (hereinafter referred to as the Colonial Government):—

1. An application for registry of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government shall be made in writing under the hand of the Colonial Secretary of the Falkland Islands or other officer of the Colonial Government nominated by the Governor, or by one of the Crown Agents for the Colonies. Such application shall contain the following particulars:—

(i.) A statement of the name and description of the ship.

(ii.) A statement of the time when and place where the ship was built, or, if the ship was foreign built and the time and place of building are unknown, a statement to that effect and of her foreign name.

(iii.) A statement of the nature of the title to the said ship, whether by original construction by or for the Colonial Government, or by purchase, capture, condemnation, or otherwise, and a list of the documents of title, if any, in case she was not originally constructed by or for the Colonial Government.

iv.) A statement of the name of the Master.

2. The Registrar, on receiving such application in respect of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government, shall—

(i.) enter the ship in the Register Book as belonging to "His Majesty, represented by the Government of the Colony of the Falkland Islands" and shall also enter therein:

(ii.) the name of the port to which she belongs;

(iii.) the particulars stated in the application for registration;

(iv.) the details comprised in the Surveyor's Certificate.

3. On the registry of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government the Registrar shall retain in his possession the Surveyor's Certificate and the application for registry and any documents of title mentioned in such application.

4. Upon the transfer of a registered Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government by Bill of Sale, the Colonial Government shall be the transferors, and the Bill of Sale shall be in Form A in the proper form prescribed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, hereinafter called the principal Act, omitting the covenant therein contained. Any such Bill of Sale shall be signed by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid on behalf of the Colonial Government.

5. The application for a Certificate of Sale referred to in Sections 39 to 42 and Sections 44 to 46 of the principal Act, may be made in respect of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid on behalf of the Colonial Government.

6. The person to whom the management of any Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government is entrusted by the Colonial Government shall be registered as provided by Section 59 (2) of the principal Act.

7. Where any provision of the Merchant

Shipping Acts which by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order in Council is applicable to Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government imposes any duty or liability or confers any right or power upon or contemplates any act being performed by the owner of a ship such duty, liability, right, or power shall, subject always to the other provisions of this Order in Council be carried out, borne, or exercised by the Colonial Government on behalf of His Majesty.

8. In this Order in Council the term Merchant Shipping Acts shall mean and include any of the Merchant Shipping Acts, any provision of which is by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order applicable to Government ships.

9. The following sections and provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts shall not apply to Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government registered in pursuance of this Order, namely:—

(i.) *The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.*—Section 1, 8 to 12, 427 to 431.

The provisions of Part II. of the Act relating to the requirement of officers to hold certificates of competency and the production of those certificates.

(ii.) *The Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898.*—Section 3 and 5.

(iii.) *The Merchant Shipping Act, 1906.*—Sections 25 and 27.

Provided always that no provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts which, according to a reasonable construction, would not apply in the case of Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government, shall be deemed to apply to such ships by reason only that its application is not hereby expressly excluded.

10. Anything required or authorised by this Order in Council to be done by the Colonial Government may be done by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid.

The Scottish Board of Health hereby give notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that they will recognise as from the date of commencement of the Regulations each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedules hereto as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition is subject to the conditions set out in the headings to the schedules, and where the certificate is in the form of a label the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Certificates recognised for the purposes of items (a) and (c) of the Second Schedule to the Regulations, *i.e.* :—

(a) Any severed part of the carcase of a pig (including the severed head and the whole carcase without the head) which has not been salted, cured, pickled, dried or smoked or otherwise prepared in the manner in which bacon or ham is ordinarily prepared, and from which no submaxillary, pre-scapular, pre-crural, or popliteal gland has been taken out;

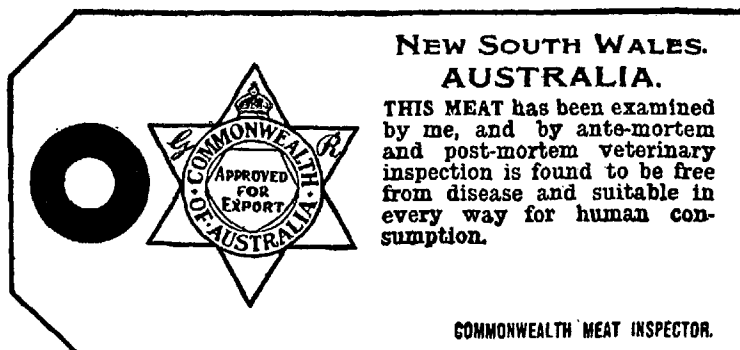
(c) All edible parts of a pig other than (i) the head or other severed parts of the carcase and (ii) the intestines prepared in the form of sausage casings.
