#### REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF WRITING ASSISTANT (FEMALE) IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.

*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The limits of age are 16 and 17. For an examination beginning in one of the first six months of the year the governing date on which candidates must be of the prescribed age is the first of March; for an examination beginning in one of the last six months of the year the governing date is the first of September. A candidate who attained the age of 16 on the governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained 17 on that date would not be admitted. Candidates who have served
