ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST JULY 1925.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended

for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II. (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

The Order of the Minister, dated the ninth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, defining the said premises as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of one male Indian antelope, shall not apply to the movement into the said premises of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulation Applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4. The animals on being landed shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an

Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

FOREIGN HAY AND STRAW (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Prohibition of Landing of Hay and Straw from States of California and Texas.

1. Hay and Straw brought from the States of California and Texas, in the United States of America, shall be subject to the prohibition of landing contained in the Foreign Hay and Straw Order of 1912.

Revocation.

2. The Foreign Hay and Straw (Amendment) Order of 1925 is hereby revoked.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall take immediate effect, provided that such prohibition shall not apply to hay and straw shipped from the State of Texas before the date of this Order.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOREIGN HAY AND STRAW (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 2).
