## TOBERMORY ELECTRICITY.

**N**OTICE is hereby given that application has been made to the Electricity Commissioners by the Provost, Magistrates, and Councillors of the Burgh of Tobermory, in the County of Argyll (hereinafter referred to as "the Undertakers"), whose address is Town Clerk's Office, Tobermory, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for the following, among other, purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Undertakers to generate, store, distribute, sell, and supply electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, within the Burgh of Tobermory (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply").

2. To authorise the Undertakers to acquire by compulsion or agreement and to hold and

use for the purposes of a generating station or stations the land hereinafter described, namely:—

All and whole that piece of land consisting of .210 of an Acre or thereby situate in the Burgh of Tobermory, Island of Mull and County of Argyll, on the western side of the public road leading from Tobermory to Salen and extending 127 feet or thereby along the said road, and bounded on the west by land presently belonging to the Representatives of the late W. H. MacLean, along which it extends in a south-easterly direction 60 feet or thereby; thence in a south-westerly direction along the existing stone wall 56 feet or thereby; thence in a southerly direction 60 feet or thereby; on the north or north-west by land belonging to Alexander Allan of Aros, and comprehending the alveus of the Tobermory River with its banks on either side along which it extends 58 feet or thereby; on the south or south-east by land belonging to the said Alexander Allan, and comprehending the alveus of the Tobermory River with its banks aforesaid along which it extends 87 feet or thereby.

3. To confer upon the Undertakers such of the powers contained in the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, and in the enactments incorporated therewith as are usually conferred upon distributors of electrical energy, and to incorporate with the Order and make applicable to the Undertakers and the proposed undertaking with such variations as are or may be contained in the Order all or some of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899.

4. The roads or streets or parts thereof within which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within the period specified in the Order are as follows:—

Breast or Main Street, Ace Brae, Continuation of Breadalbane Street to Jura Cottage; Breadalbane Street; West Street and Prison Brae; Albert Street; Victoria Street; Argyll

Terrace, Erray Road,—from Public School to Achnacroibh Lodge; Back Brae,—from Public School to Junction of Road to Western Isles Hotel and Badarroch, Western Isles Hotel and Badarroch Road; and Middle Brae.

It is proposed to lay electric lines by means of overhead wires in all the said roads or streets or parts thereof except Breast or Main Street.

5. To authorise the Undertakers to take, collect, and recover rents, rates and charges for the supply of electricity for lighting, heating, power and other purposes, and for the use of any machines, lamps, meters, fittings, or apparatus connected therewith, and to prescribe and limit the price to be charged therefor.

Every local or other public authority, company, or person desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the application must do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, London, W.C. 2, and despatched on or before the 19th day of October 1925, and a copy of such objection must also be sent to the under-mentioned Solicitor or Parliamentary Agents.
