

WIDOWS', ORPHANS', AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACT, 1925.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, acting jointly with the Minister of Health and the Scottish Board of Health, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 23 (1) of the Widows', Orphans', and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act, 1925, and by the Contributory Pensions (Joint Committee) Regulations, 1925, to make Regulations prescribing the cases in which a widow's or orphan's pension shall be payable notwithstanding that the claimant has not been resident in Great Britain for a period of two years prior to the date of the death of the husband, father or mother, as the case may be.

GLASGOW JUVENILE DELINQUENCY PREVENTION AND REPRESSION.

NOTICE is hereby given that Application is intended to be made to the Secretary for Scotland on or before the 17th day of December next by Petition under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 by the Education Authority of the Burgh of Glasgow (hereinafter referred to as "the Education Authority") for a Provisional Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

To provide for the transfer to the Education Authority of the reformatory school known as the Chapelton Training School for Girls, East Chapelton, Bearsden, near the City and Royal Burgh of Glasgow (hereinafter referred to as "the City"), and of the industrial schools known as the Boys' Industrial School, Mossbank, Hogganfield, near the City, the Boys' Home in Whitevale Street, in the City, in connection therewith, the Girls' Industrial School, Maryhill, in the City, the Girls' Home in Rottenrow, in the City, in connection therewith, Rottenrow Day Industrial School, in the City, Green Street Day Industrial School, in the City, Rose Street Day Industrial School, in the City, William Street Day Industrial School, in the City, and Hopehill Road Day Industrial School, in the City, hitherto managed by The Directors of Houses of Refuge and Reformatory and Industrial Schools in the City of Glasgow (hereinafter referred to as "the Directors") together with the powers, duties, assets and liabilities of the Directors and of the Commissioners for the Prevention and Repression of Juvenile Delinquency in the City of Glasgow (hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioners");

To provide that the Education Authority may admit into Protestant industrial and reformatory schools inmates not of the Protestant faith;

To provide that the Education Authority with the consent of the Scottish Education Department (hereinafter referred to as "the Department") may renounce the certificate of any Protestant reformatory industrial or other school and may close such schools and may transfer the activities carried on at and the inmates of such schools to other schools not-
