WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 19th day of March 1926 (C.W. 2492/26), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas we consider that Officers employed on photographic duties in Your Majesty's Navy should receive a special allowance in view of the amount of extra work involved in such duties :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of an allowance at the rate of 1s a day being paid to Officers not above Lieutenant-Commander's rank who are appointed to Ships of Your Majesty's Navy for photographic duties in addition to ordinary Ship's duties, this allowance to be payable from the 9th March 1926,

and to be subject to the Regulations applicable to payment of duty allowances generally :

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 24th day of March 1926 (N. 5141/25), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are

from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's orders in Council bearing dates the 13th day of October 1922, and the 12th day of March 1923, a Royal Marine Police Force was established with rates of pay and conditions of service as set forth therein:

"And whereas we consider that titles should be established to designate the respective ranks of the Royal Marine Police Force:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that certain of the conditions of service laid down in the above Orders in Council should be revised:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise the use of the titles set forth hereunder:

<i>Rank.</i>	<i>Title.</i>
Commissioned Officers.	Chief Inspector.
Grade I.	Inspector.
Grade II.	Sergeant.
Grade III.	Constable.

"We beg leave further to recommend that the rates of pay and retiring gratuities payable under the above Orders in Council to Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marine Police may, as from the 1st day of July 1924, be reduced by 5½ per cent., and may be subject to further review on or after the 1st day of July 1927, the retiring gratuity for the whole of an Officer's service in the Royal Marine Police being calculated at the rate in force at the date of retirement:

"We beg leave further to recommend that Inspectors of the Royal Marine Police may, as from the 8th day of January 1926, rank relatively with Staff Sergeants, Royal Marines, and be paid at the following rates, namely:

On promotion	10s. 6d. per diem.
After 2½ years' service in that Grade	12s. per diem.
After 5 years' service in that Grade	13s. 6d. per diem.
After 10 years' service in that Grade	15s. per diem.

"We beg leave further to recommend that the rate of gratuity payable to Inspectors of the Royal Marine Police on discharge from the Force on or after the 8th day of January 1926, may be reduced to £3 for each complete calendar month of service in any rank of the Force, subject to a maximum gratuity of £540:

"We beg leave further to recommend that the gratuity payable on discharge to any non-commissioned Officer or man of the Royal Marine Police on or after the 2nd day of April 1925, may, if his character has been assessed lower than 'very good' for any period of service in the Royal Marine Police, be subject, at our discretion, to a reduction of 25 per cent. in the amount earned for the period covered by such assessment; and that, in the event of a second or subsequent assessment of his character below 'very good,' the amount of gratuity earned for the periods covered by such second or subsequent assessments may be subject, at our discretion, to a reduction of 50 per cent.:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 16th April 1926, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 19th April 1926, to Saturday, the 24th April 1926, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday, 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
