AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 2ND JUNE 1926.)

IMPORTATION OF CARCASSES (PRO-  
HIBITION) ORDER OF 1926.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Prohibition of landing in Great Britain of Animal Carcasses and certain Animal Products from the Continent of Europe.*

1. The landing in Great Britain of a carcase or part of a carcase as defined in this Order brought from any country on the Continent of Europe other than Ireland, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man is hereby prohibited: Provided that this prohibition shall not apply to—

(a) fully cured bacon and ham, lard, or rendered fat, cooked or preserved meats or meat essences;

(b) hides and skins which have been dried, dry-salted or wet-salted; but hides or skins which have been wet-salted shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by a duly authorised officer of the Government of the country in which the port of shipment is situated to the effect that he is satisfied that the hides or skins have been wet-salted for a period of fourteen days. Such certificate shall be delivered to an officer of Customs and Excise at the port of landing.

*Interpretation.*

2. In this Order "carcase" means the carcase of any cattle, sheep, pigs or goats, and

includes meat, hides, skins, hair, bones, bone meal, hoofs, hoof meal, horns, horn meal, offal, blood, dried blood and blood meal, or any other part of a carcase separately or otherwise or any portion thereof.

*Offences.*

3. If any carcase or part of a carcase is landed in Great Britain in contravention of this Order the owner thereof and the importer and the occupier of the place of landing and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed shall each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

4. This Order shall take immediate effect, provided that it shall not apply to a consignment which according to the ship's papers was shipped before midnight on the third/fourth day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

*Short Title.*

5. This Order may be cited as the IMPORTATION OF CARCASSES (PROHIBITION) ORDER OF 1926.
