BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRADE
BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY CERTAIN MINIMUM RATES OF
WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS
AND TO CANCEL OVERTIME RATES FOR OUT-
WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922, and 1st April, 1926, respectively, the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY certain General Minimum Piece-Rates, General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for male and female workers and to CANCEL the Overtime Rates for Outworkers as at present set out in the Notices D. (32) and D. (34) dated 12th May, 1926, respectively, issued by the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain).

Particulars of the Minimum Rates proposed are available for inspection at the address shown

below, or may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

Under Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 14th day of December, 1926. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain), 1 Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
