**SEA FISHERIES (SCOTLAND) ACTS.
SOLWAY FIRTH.**

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has confirmed Byelaw No. 37 made by the Fishery Board for Scotland, whereby Byelaw No. 28 made by the Board on the 18th December 1914 is revoked, and its provisions re-enacted with modifications as regards the minimum size of the mesh of trawl nets permitted to be used in the territorial waters on the Scottish side of the Solway Firth lying to the north-east of a line drawn from Southernness Lighthouse in Kirkcudbrightshire to Dubmill Point in Cumberland.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

MILK DISTRIBUTIVE TRADE BOARD
(SCOTLAND).

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922 and 1st April, 1926, respectively, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Scotland for the Milk Distributive Trade Specified in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, as altered by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1926, **HEREBY GIVE NOTICE** that they **PROPOSE TO FIX** Minimum Rates of Wages for certain classes of Male and Female Workers as shown in the Schedule set out below.

SCHEDULE.

PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THOSE BRANCHES OF THE TRADE NEWLY BROUGHT WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE TRADE BOARD BY THE TRADE BOARDS (MILK DISTRIBUTIVE) ORDER, 1926.

The Trade Board **PROPOSE TO FIX** Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers by providing that the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice M.D.S. (12), dated 22nd April, 1927, which are effective as from 25th April, 1927, as respects workers employed in the trade specified in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, shall apply in the same manner to workers of the same classes who are employed on work included by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1926, which is not included by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920.

The trade as specified in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, is as follows:—

1.—(a) The wholesale or retail sale of fresh milk when carried on as a main or distinct business or as a distinct branch or department of a business;

(b) the sale of food or drink for consumption on the premises, or of other goods, when any such sale is carried on in association with and as a subsidiary part of such business, branch or department as foresaid, if such sale involves the employment of workers who are principally employed in the sale specified in (a) above;

2.—(a) the following operations when incidental to the sales specified in 1 above:—

(i.) boxing, parcelling, labelling, weighing, measuring, checking, bottling, unpacking, packing;

(ii.) collecting, delivering, dispatching, horse-keeping, cleaning vehicles;

(iii.) portering, lift or hoist operating, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping, warehousing, cleaning premises;

(iv.) pasteurising, cooling, separating of milk;

(v.) cleaning utensils or receptacles;

(vi.) blending, testing, sampling;

(vii.) other incidental operations;

(b) clerical work or canvassing when incidental to and carried on in conjunction with the work specified in 1 above,

but excluding any operations in:

(a) the transport of goods by common carriers;

(b) any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto;

(c) Post Office business;

(d) Agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917.

The alterations made by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1926, are as follows:—

1. There are inserted in paragraph 2 (a) (iv.) of the Appendix to the Trade Board (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920:—

after the word "pasteurising" the words "homogenizing, sterilising."

2. The following new paragraph is added to the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, after paragraph 2, that is to say:

“ 3. For the purposes of this Appendix, the expression ‘ fresh milk ’ shall include ‘ sterilized milk.’ ”

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 22nd April, 1927. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Milk Distributive Trade Board (Scotland), 1 Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

NOTICE.

PUBLIC HEALTH (OVERSEA MEAT) REGULATIONS (SCOTLAND), 1925.

The Scottish Board of Health give notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that they hereby recognise for the purposes of items (a) and (c) of the Second Schedule to the Regulations, *i.e.*:—

(a) Any severed part of the carcase of a pig (including the severed head and the whole carcase without the head) which has not been salted, cured, pickled, dried or smoked or otherwise prepared in the manner in which bacon or ham is ordinarily prepared, and from which no submaxillary, pre-scapular, pre-crural, or popliteal gland has been taken out;

(c) All edible parts of a pig other than (i) the head or other severed parts of the carcase and (ii) the intestines prepared in the form of sausage casings;

each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition applies only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

The label hereby recognised as an Official Certificate for meat imported from the Argentine Republic is in substitution for the mark or stamp of which particulars were given in Part I. of the First Schedule to the Notice published in the Edinburgh Gazette of 30th June 1925.

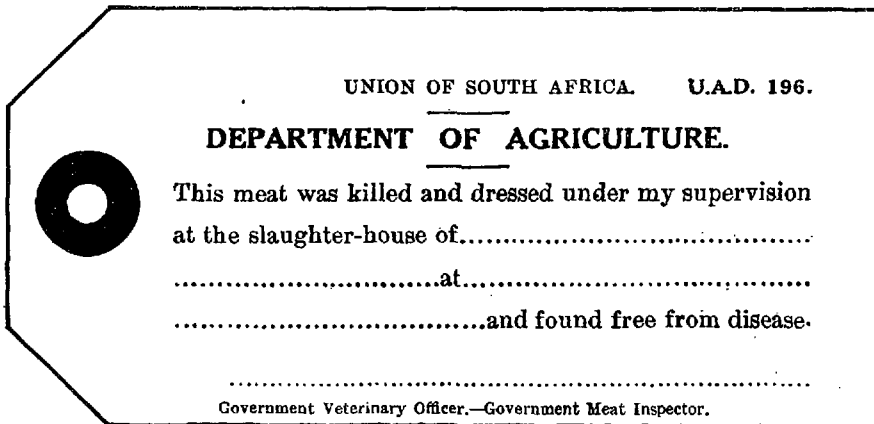
I. ARGENTINE REPUBLIC.
