Special Regulations for the Normal Recruitment of Male Assistant Preventive Officers in the Waterguard Service of the Customs and Excise Department.

- 1. Candidates must have attained the age of 19 and must not have attained the age of 21 on the first day of the written examination.
- In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made:—
 - (i) Persons who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceedind two years during which they have served.
 - (ii) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

- 2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the sons of fathers also natural born British subjects: provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception to the latter condition of the rule may be made in the case of candidates who have served in H.M. Armed Forces during the Great Warbetween the 4th August 1914 and the 11th November 1918.
- 3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination dated before the commencement of the examination and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the examination.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 4. Candidates will be required to undergo a written examination in the following subjects:—
 - English (including Writing and Spelling).
 - 2. Reading Manuscript.
 - 3. Arithmetic.
 - 4. Geography
 - 5. General knowledge.

And candidates who obtain such an aggregate of marks in this written examination as to-satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners will be regarded as qualified to appear before the Selection Board. Success in the written examination will not in itself confer any claim to appointment.

- 5. Candidates who pass the written examination will be summoned for competitive interview by a Selection Board, and on the result of that interview the Selection Board will prepare a list of successful candidates, in order of merit, sufficient in number to fill such vacancies as have been reported to be filled on the result of the competition. Candidates interviewed by the Selection Board whose names are not included in that list will have no claim to an appointment.
- 6. Successful candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. They will be subjected to a rigid medical examination; they must possess full normal eyesight (without the aid of glasses) and good hearing; and they must be physically capable of performing the active duties of the Waterguard Service.
