The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 7 of the Indian Church Measure, 1927, it is enacted that the Measure shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by His Majesty in Council, but no date shall be so fixed unless and until an Act of Parliament is passed providing for the repeal of Part X. of the Government of India Act so far as it relates to the Church of England:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the Indian Church Measure, 1927, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The day on which the said Measure shall come into operation shall be the 1st day of January 1928.

2. This Order may be cited as the Indian Church Measure, 1927 (Date of Commencement) Order, 1927.

And whereas pursuant to the provisions of the said recited Act and of Section 7 of the War Pensions (Administrative Provisions) Act, 1918, eight of the members of the said Corporation are appointed by Warrant under the Royal Sign Manual, and hold office for a term of three years, being eligible for re-

And whereas, in pursuance of the powers vested in Us by the said Acts, We did, by Warrants under Our Royal Sign Manual bearing date the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, the nineteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, appoint you Our said Most Dear Uncle and Counsellor Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, together with the persons therein named to be members of the

Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven;

Now know ye that We do by these Presents under Our Royal Sign Manual, ordain and declare that you Our said Most Dear Uncle and Counsellor Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, together with you the said Sir Frederick William Stopford, Sir Frederic Edward Errington Brock, Sir Harry Edwin Haward, Archibald Edwards Widdows, William Sanger, Arthur William Smallwood and Elisabeth Harriott Kelly, shall be Members of the Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation, to exercise for the term of three years from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, in conjunction with the six members co-opted by the General Council, and the ex-officio members specified in the First Schedule to the Act first above recited, the powers and duties transferred to that body as aforesaid, and generally to carry into effect the provisions of the said Act.

And We do further ordain that you Our said Most Dear Uncle and Counsellor Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, shall be President of the General Council of the said Corporation.

DANGEROUS DRUGS.

Authority dated 30th December 1927, granted by the Secretary of State, under the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5, c. 46), to Owners of British Steam Fishing Vessels to be in possession of a preparation containing cocaine.

- I. In pursuance of the Pangereus Drugs A.1, 1920, I hereby grant to the owner of every British Steam Fishing Vessel for the time being registered under the Merchant Shipping Acts, an authority to be in possession, for the purpose of giving first aid treatment in cases of injury to the eye, of a preparation consisting of an admixture of cocaine in castor oil with mercuric chloride in a proportion of not more than one part in 200 of cocaine and not less than one part in 3000 of mercuric chloride (hereinafter called "the preparation"), subject to the following conditions:—
 - (a) It shall be obtained only in such quantities as are necessary for the purpose of supplying the Fishing Vessels of the owner with the medical stores required to be provided under the Merchant Shipping Acts, and may be used for this purpose and no other;
 - (b) All stocks of the preparation shall be kept at the office or ordinary place of business of the owner and in a locked receptacle of which the key shall remain in the possession of the owner or a responsible person nominated by him in

writing, and the preparation shall be issued to the Fishing Vessels of the owner only by the person who has charge of the said key;

- (c) The owner shall enter, or cause to be entered, in a book to be kept for the sole purpose, particulars of all supplies of the preparation obtained, including the date, quantity and name and address of person from whom obtained. The entry shall be made on the day on which the preparation is received or, where that is not reasonably convenient, on the following day. The book shall be preserved for not less than two years from the date of the last entry;
- (d) All stocks of the preparation, and the book referred to in the preceding condition, shall be produced for inspection when required by any constable or other person authorised in that behalf by any general or special order of the Secretary of State.

II. In this Authority the expression "the owner" means the person registered under the Merchant Shipping Acts as the owner of the vessel, or, where a managing owner or manager has been appointed, the managing owner or manager.

III. The Authority, dated 13th August 1921, granted by the Secretary of State to Skippers of British Fishing Vessels to be in possession of tinctura chloroformi et morphinæ composita and tinctura opii is revoked as from 1st January 1928.

IV. This Authority may be revoked at any time by order of the Secretary of State.
