(APPLICATION OF TRANSFERRED PROPERTY)  
ORDER, 1928.

In virtue of the powers conferred on me by Sub-section two of Section six of the National Galleries of Scotland Act, 1906 (6 Edw. 7, ch. 50), I, the Right Honourable Sir John Gilmour, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby prescribe with regard to the funds which are at present held in terms of the said Sub-section by the Board of Trustees established by the said Act, but are so far unallocated in respect that purposes have not been prescribed for the application thereof, that a portion of the general fund of the Board shall be applied by the Board for the following purpose:—

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR SITUATIONS IN THE GENERAL EXECUTIVE CLASS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE, IN EXECUTIVE BRANCHES IN THE DEFENCE DEPARTMENTS, AND FOR POSTS OF ASSISTANT AUDITORS IN THE EXCHEQUER AND AUDIT DEPARTMENT, AND OF ASSISTANT EXAMINERS IN THE ESTATE DUTY OFFICE (INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT).

With the exception of posts in executive branches in the Defence Departments, for which men only are eligible, competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women.

These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age are 18 and 19. For the examination to be held in October 1928, the governing date on which candidates must be of the prescribed age is the 1st January 1929. A candidate who attained the age of 18 on the

governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained 19 on that date would not be admitted.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

3. No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

6. All candidates take subjects 1 to 3. They may also offer any three or four of the subjects 4 to 15. The marks will be adjusted so as to give equal opportunity to the candidate who offers three subjects and the candidate who offers four subjects.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service. Subject to this condition, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

8. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. A fee of £4 will be required from every candidate attending an examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 2nd October 1928. The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the examination may be held:—Belfast, Cardiff, Edinburgh, London and Manchester.

The final list of centres will be decided when the number of candidates desiring examination at each centre is known.

Not fewer than 50 candidates will be appointed on the result of the examination, if so many should be found to be duly qualified.

No person will be admitted to examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 9th August, an application, in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

ORDER OF THE SCOTTISH BOARD OF HEALTH, APPLYING SECTION I. OF THE VENEREAL DISEASE ACT, 1917, TO THE COUNTIES OF FIFE AND KINROSS, INCLUDING THE BURGHS THEREIN.

Whereas by Section I. of the Venereal Disease Act, 1917, it is enacted as follows:—

“ 1. (1) In any area in which this section is in operation a person shall not, unless he is a qualified medical practitioner, for reward either direct or indirect, treat any person for venereal disease, or prescribe any remedy therefor, or give any advice in connection with the treatment thereof, whether the advice is given to the person to be treated or to any other person.

“(2) This section shall operate in any area to which it is applied by Order of the Local Government Board, or in Scotland and Ireland, the Local Government Board for Scotland and Ireland respectively:

“ Provided that no Order shall be made in respect of any area until a scheme for the gratuitous treatment of persons in that area suffering from venereal disease has been approved by the Local Government Board, or in Scotland and Ireland, the Local Government Board for Scotland and Ireland respectively, and is already in operation.”

And whereas in terms of the Scottish Board of Health Act, 1919, the powers and duties of the Local Government Board for Scotland have been transferred to the Scottish Board of Health;

And whereas the Scottish Board of Health have approved a scheme for the gratuitous treatment of persons suffering from venereal disease within the area of the Counties of Fife and Kinross and the Burghs therein, which scheme is already in operation;

Now therefore We, the Scottish Board of Health, by this our Order, declare that Section I. of the Venereal Disease Act, 1917, shall operate from and after the thirty-first day of May nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, within the area of the Counties of Fife and Kinross, including the Burghs therein.
