

DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACTS—continued.**SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.**

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II. of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

Inverness.—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

Argyll.—So much of the parishes of Dunoon and Kilmun, Strachur and Lochgoilhead as is comprised within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at Strone Point in the parish of Dunoon and Kilmun, thence north-westerly and northerly along the road leading to Loch Eck *via* Kilmun, Ardbeg, Rashfield and Inverchapel; thence continuing along the road in a generally northerly direction *via* the eastern shore of Loch Eck, Invernaden, Strachur and the eastern shore of Loch Fyne to St. Catherine's; thence in a generally easterly and then southerly direction along the road *via* Laglingarten, Hell's Glen and Drimsyniebeg as far as Lochgoilhead Pier; thence proceeding southerly along the western shores of Loch Goil and Loch Long *via* Carrick Castle, Rudha nan Eoin, Ardentinny and Gairletter Point to the point of commencement.
