PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by the Representation of the People Acts power is conferred on His Majesty to make provision for various matters by Order in Council:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Order (a) (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") His Majesty was pleased by Order in Council to make provision for various matters under these Acts:

And whereas by Section 40 (2) of the Representation of the People Act, 1918 (b) any Order in Council made thereunder may be revoked or varied as occasion requires by any subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas the Representation of the People (Equal Franchise) Act, 1928 (c), which assimilates the franchises for men and women in respect of parliamentary and local elections, provides that the register of electors to be made in the year 1929 shall come into force on the 1st May 1929, and confers on His Majesty the power to make by Order in Council such alterations in the registration dates as may seem to him necessary for the purpose of the preparation of the said register.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Acts and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

*Registration Dates for 1929 Register.*

1. For the purposes of the register of electors to be made in the year 1929, the registration dates shall, as respects the several matters specified in Column 1 of the following Schedule, be the dates specified in Column 2 as regards England and Wales and Northern Ireland, and in Column 3 as regards Scotland.

- (a) In Rule 4 (2) of the Order, which relates to claims by persons residing outside the polling districts in which they are entitled to be registered to vote at the polling places of other polling districts, there shall be substituted the 27th day of February for the 18th day of August, the 14th day of March for the 3rd day of September and the 27th day of February for the 18th day of September.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR SITUATIONS IN THE GENERAL POST OFFICE AS MALE ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT OF TRAFFIC (CLASS II.) IN THE LONDON TELEPHONE SERVICE, AND MALE ASSISTANT TRAFFIC SUPERINTENDENT IN THE PROVINCES.

N.B.—*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The limits of age for this Examination are 18 and 23. In reckoning age, candidates who have served, or are serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the sons of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August 1914, and 11th November 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the Examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service and Apprentices in H.M. Dockyards must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English Composition.
2. General Knowledge.
3. Lower Mathematics.
4. Electricity.
5. *Either* Higher Mathematics or Telephony.
6. *Either* Mechanics or Electrotechnology or Telegraphy
7. Personal Qualities.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate number of marks in subjects 1 to 6 taken together as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners; and they must also pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in subject 7.

The Examination may be held in two parts at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In this case the first part of the Examination, viz., subjects 1 to 6 inclusive, will be used to reduce the number of competitors to be admitted to the second part, viz., subject 7. Of those who pass and obtain



the highest aggregate marks on the first part a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the Examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks in the whole Examination.

6. Applications for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

7. A fee of £4 5s will be required from every candidate.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 13th December 1928. The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the first part of the examination may be held:—Birmingham, Bristol, Glasgow, Leeds, London and Manchester.

The final list of centres will be decided when the number of candidates desiring examination at each centre is known.

Not fewer than 12 candidates will be appointed on the result of this Examination, if so many should be found to be duly qualified.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 25th October, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

NATIONAL INSURANCE ACTS, 1924 AND 1926, AND THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1926.
