The KING has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal of the Realm empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of Christ in Canterbury to elect an Archbishop of that See, the same being void by the resignation of the Most Reverend and Right Honourable Randall Thomas Davidson, G.C.V.O., D.D., late Archbishop thereof, and declared vacant as from the 12th November 1928 by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the 14th August 1928; and His Majesty has been pleased to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Most Reverend and Right Honourable Cosmo Gordon Lang, now Archbishop of York, Primate of England and Metropolitan, to be by them elected Archbishop of the said See of Canterbury.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd November 1928, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from

Monday the 26th November 1928 to Saturday the 1st December 1928, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

#### DANGEROUS DRUGS.

REGULATIONS, DATED NOVEMBER 14, 1928, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5, c. 46), FOR CONTROLLING THE MANUFACTURE, SALE, POSSESSION AND DISTRIBUTION OF BENZOYL-MORPHINE.

Whereas by Order in Council dated the fourteenth day of August 1928, made in pursuance of Section 8 (2) of the Dangerous

Drugs Act, 1920, His Majesty was pleased to declare that Part III. of the Act shall henceforth apply to the drug benzoyl-morphine and to any preparation, admixture and extract containing benzoyl-morphine.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks, Baronet, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of my powers under Section 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, hereby make the following regulations:—

1. No person shall manufacture or carry on any process in the manufacture of benzoyl-morphine:—

- (a) unless he is licensed or otherwise authorised by the Secretary of State to do so;
- (b) except on premises licensed for the purpose by the Secretary of State;
- (c) otherwise than in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence or authority.

2. No person shall supply or procure or offer to supply or procure benzoyl-morphine to or for any person whether in the United Kingdom or elsewhere or shall advertise benzoyl-morphine for sale:—

- (a) unless he is licensed or otherwise authorised by the Secretary of State to supply benzoyl-morphine, or unless he is licensed or otherwise authorised to manufacture benzoyl-morphine or (but so far only as regards procuring benzoyl-morphine) unless he is licensed or otherwise authorised to procure benzoyl-morphine; or
- (b) otherwise than in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence or authority.

3. No person shall be in possession of or attempt to obtain possession of benzoyl-morphine unless—

- (a) he is licensed or otherwise authorised to manufacture or supply benzoyl-morphine; or
- (b) he is otherwise licensed or authorised to be in possession of benzoyl-morphine.

4. (1) If any benzoyl-morphine authorised under the law of any country outside the United Kingdom to be exported therefrom to any destination outside the United Kingdom is brought into the United Kingdom no person shall, without the licence of the Secretary of State, cause or procure that benzoyl-morphine to be diverted to any other destination.

(2) For the purposes of this Regulation the destination to which any benzoyl-morphine is authorised to be exported shall be taken to be the destination stated in the authority for the export thereof from the country of export.

5. In these Regulations the expression "benzoyl-morphine" includes preparations containing benzoyl-morphine.

6. These Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Benzoyl-Morphine) Regulations, 1928.

DUNDEE CORPORATION.

To repeal Section 21 (For protection of Dundee Broughty Ferry and District Tramways Company) of the Dundee Corporation Order 1927 in whole or in part and any Act or Order that might prevent the Corporation from running omnibuses within any part of the City or on any specified route outwith the City and to empower the Corporation to run omnibuses on any route outwith the City.

To restrict or prohibit the running of omnibuses by any local authority company body or person (other than the Corporation) along any roads in the City or any adjacent districts on which services of omnibuses or tram cars may be provided by the Corporation and along routes in competition with such services of the Corporation.

To empower the licensing authority when licensing an omnibus to ply for hire to grant license subject to conditions and to give the

Corporation right to notice of and to be heard on any applications for licenses and appeals in respect thereof.

To enable the Corporation and other bodies and persons to enter into agreements in reference to the omnibus services and other matters connected with or necessary for any of the objects and purposes of the Order.

To make provision for the adaptation of roads, bridges &c.

To enable the Minister of Transport, the Corporation and any other local authority affected to make bye-laws and regulations.

To confer repeal vary or extinguish all rights, powers, authorities, jurisdictions, exemptions and privileges.

To incorporate and make applicable various Acts and Orders.

Notice is hereby further given that the Petition for the Order and the draft Order and printed copies thereof respectively will be lodged on or before the 17th day of December next with the Secretary of State, Scottish Office, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, and on or before the same day printed copies of the draft Order will be deposited in the Office of the Clerk of the Parliaments, House of Lords and in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
