ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRADE, DATED JANUARY 1, 1929, UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5, C. 28), PRESCRIBING THE RATE OF CONTRIBUTION TO THE GAS FUND FOR THE YEAR 1929.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 7 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, the Board of Trade hereby prescribe that:—

1. The rate of contribution to the Gas Fund for the year 1929 shall be one shilling for each million cubic feet of gas sold during the year 1928.

2. Such contribution shall, on or before the 1st April 1929, be paid to the Board of Trade at Great George Street, London, S.W.1, by any Gas Undertakers with respect to whom an order under the said Act shall have been made, by cheque made payable to the "Board of Trade" and crossed "Gas Fund Account."
