**SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.**

The following Areas are now " Movement Areas " for the purposes of Part II. of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

*Inverness.*—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

*Ross and Cromarty.*—An Area comprising the Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.
