NAIRN ELECTRICITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that application has been made to the Electricity Commissioners by Johnson & Phillips Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Undertakers"), whose registered office is at Columbia House, Aldwych, London, W.C.2, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1926, for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

To authorise the Undertakers to generate produce store sell supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the said Acts within the Burgh of Nairn in the County of Nairn (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply").

To authorise the Undertakers to acquire by compulsion or agreement feu take on lease and hold the land hereinafter described or some part or parts thereof and any estates rights or interests or any servitudes in or over the same and to empower the Undertakers upon the said land or any part thereof to erect maintain work and use a station or stations with all necessary or convenient buildings plant machinery works apparatus and conveniences for generating and transforming electricity.

The said land is:—

All and whole that piece of land consisting of .44 of an acre or thereabouts situate in the Burgh of Nairn and bounded on the north by the London Midland and Scottish Railway on the east south and west by agricultural land presently belonging or reputed to belong to Robert Lumsden Mackintosh and the Misses Mackintosh.

To authorise the Undertakers to exercise within the area of supply all the powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity.

To prescribe and limit the price to be charged for the supply of electricity.

To authorise the Undertakers to break up streets and parts of streets not repairable by the local authority within the area of supply.

A copy of the Draft Order and of the Map showing the area of supply and the streets and parts of streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified in the Order together with a plan of the site of the land hereinbefore referred to and a book of reference to such plan have been deposited for public inspection with the principal Sheriff Clerk of the County of Nairn at his Office in Nairn and with the Town Clerk of Nairn at his Office in Nairn.

Any authority company body or person desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objections respecting the application must do so by letter sent by registered post addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, London, W.C.2, and despatched on or before the 15th day of February 1929, and a copy of any such objections must at the same time be forwarded to either the undermentioned Solicitors or Parliamentary Agents.

BEAULY ELECTRICITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Beauly Electric Supply Company Limited, whose registered office is situate at 7 Queen's Gate, Inverness (hereinafter called "the Company"), is applying to the Electricity Commissioners under the provisions of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1926, for a Special Order for the following amongst other purposes that is to say:—

1. To authorise the Company to generate and distribute electricity for public and private purposes as defined by the said Acts within so much of the Parish of Kilmorack in the Second or Aird District of the County of Inverness as lies within the circumference of an imaginary circle having a radius of one and three quarter miles from the Square, Beauly, as the said Parish is constituted at the commencement of this Order (hereinafter called "the area of supply").

2. To authorise the Company to exercise in the area of supply the powers usually conferred on distributors of electrical energy and to prescribe the maximum prices to be charged under the Order.

3. To authorise the Company to break up streets and parts of streets not repairable by the Local Authority in the area of supply.

4. To provide for laying down electric lines in certain streets and parts of streets in the area of supply within a period to be specified in the Order.

5. A printed copy of the draft Order and a Map showing the proposed area of supply and the streets and parts of streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time have been deposited for public inspection at the Office of the Sheriff Clerk for the County of Inverness at The Castle, Inverness, the Office of the Clerk to the Second or Aird District Committee of the County of Inverness, at The Castle, Inverness, and at the Office of the Parish Council of Kilmorack at Phipps Institute, Beauly, and printed copies of the draft Order can be obtained from Mr. Finlay Urquhart, Plumber, Fraser Street, Beauly, and from the under-
