This Order shall come into force on the first day of October 1929, and the Order of the Secretary for Scotland dated the 27th August 1889, determining the number of County Councillors for each County Council in Scotland and apportioning them between the county and each of the burghs entitled to be represented on the County Council, so far as relating to the County of Kincardine, and the Order of the Boundary Commissioners under the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, dated the 3rd November, 1891, relating to the County of Kincardine, are hereby repealed as from 16th May 1930.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT,
1924 (a).

DETERMINATION OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE
UNDER SECTION 116, SUBSECTION (1).

Whereas by Section 59, as read with paragraph (4) of Section 80 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (b) (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1911), it was amongst other things enacted that an Insurance Committee should be constituted for every county, and also for every burgh or police burgh within the meaning of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, containing within the police boundaries thereof according to the census of 1911 a population of twenty thousand or upwards; and it was further enacted that all other burghs and police burghs should for the purposes of Part I. of the Act be held to be within the county, and unless already represented on the County Council should for such purposes be represented thereon as determined by the Secretary for Scotland.

And whereas the Secretary for Scotland on the 25th day of May 1912 issued determina-

tions under the powers so conferred on him with reference to the number of representatives to be elected by the following burghs to the County Councils of the Counties in which they are situated:—

- Burgh of Brechin. (Angus)
- Burgh of Elgin. (Moray)
- Burgh of Forfar. (Angus)
- Burgh of Galashiels. (Selkirk)
- Burgh of Hawick. (Roxburgh)
- Burgh of Montrose. (Angus)
- Burgh of Port Glasgow. (Renfrew)

And whereas the Act of 1911 was repealed by the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1924) with the exception of certain parts including paragraph (4) of Section 80.

And whereas by Section 48 as read with Section 116 (1) of the Act of 1924, it is amongst other things enacted that an Insurance Committee shall be constituted for every county, and also for every burgh or police burgh within the meaning of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, containing within the police boundaries thereof according to the census of 1911 a population of twenty thousand or upwards; and it is further enacted that all other burghs and police burghs shall
