MERCHANT SHIPPING ACTS, 1894 to 1906.

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council the draft of an Order in Council under Section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, to provide for the registration as British ships of Government ships in the service of His Majesty's Government in the Union of South Africa.

And notice is hereby further given, that copies of the proposed draft Order in Council can be obtained by any public body within forty days of the date of this notice at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

VALUATION (SCOTLAND).

The Local Government (Supplementary Valuation Roll, Domestic Water Rate) Order (Scotland), 1929, dated August 22, 1929, made by the Secretary of State under Section 49 (2) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929 (19 & 20 Geo. 5, c. 25).

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 49 (2) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1929"), and

of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Local Government (Supplementary Valuation Roll, Domestic Water Rate) Order (Scotland), 1929.
2. (1) In this Order and the Schedule thereto—the expression "agricultural lands and heritages" has the meaning assigned to it in the Rating and Valuation (Apportionment) Act, 1928; (a) the expression "rateable value for the purposes of the domestic water rate levied under the Public Health (Scotland) Amendment Act, 1891" (b) means, in relation to agricultural lands and heritages, the value that would have been the rateable value of such lands and heritages if the Act of 1929 (other than subsection (5) of Section 44) had not passed.
- (2) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (c) applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. (1) Subject to the provisions with respect to modifications hereinafter contained, a Supplementary Valuation Roll made up in terms of Section 49 (2) of the Act of 1929, showing the rateable value for the purposes of the domestic water rate levied under the Public Health (Scotland) Amendment Act, 1891, of agricultural lands and heritages shall be in the
