MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

IMPORTED MALT PRODUCTS.

It is announced that a reference has been made to the Standing Committee set up under the above-mentioned Act by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department, and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, in respect of an application for an Order in Council under the Act to require the marking with an indication of origin of imported malt extract; malt flour; malt extract and cod liver oil; and malt extract blended with any other product in such a way that malt extract comprises more than 50 per cent. of the whole.

Attention is called to the fact that, under the provisions of the Act, while the Committee in every case referred to them must consider whether the goods should bear the indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also, at their discretion, consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.
