VARIATION AND FIXING OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES IN THE RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE IN SCOTLAND.

The Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Scotland) have issued a Notice dated 24th January 1930, setting out Minimum Rates of Wages as varied and fixed by them and confirmed by Order of the Minister of Labour to take effect as from 27th January 1930, together with all Minimum Rates previously in operation which are unaffected by the present variation.

VARIATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES IN THE DRIFT NETS MENDING TRADE IN GREAT BRITAIN.

The Drift Nets Mending Trade Board (Great Britain) have issued a Notice, E. (8), dated 24th January 1930, setting out Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by them and confirmed by an Order of the Minister of Labour, to take effect as from the 27th January 1930, for Female Workers.

Under and by virtue of the Powers conferred upon the Clearing Office and the Administrator by Article 1 (xiv.) of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920-1921, a Rule was made on the 5th (fifth) day of February 1923, duly approved by the President of the Board of Trade, prescribing the 31st (thirty-first) day of March 1923 as the final date by which proofs by British nationals of debts due to them by Austrian nationals or of pecuniary obligations of the Austrian Government under Article 248

of the Treaty of St. Germain-en-Laye, must be made upon the prescribed forms and lodged with the Department for the Administration of Austrian Property in order to participate in the distribution of the funds in the hands of the Administrator arising out of the liquidation of the property rights and interests of nationals of the former Austrian Empire transferred to or vested in him under the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920 to 1921, or any Orders of the Board of Trade made thereunder or received by him from the Austrian Clearing Office under paragraph 11 of the Annex to Article 248 of the above-mentioned Treaty in pursuance of the note of His Majesty's Government to the Austrian Government of the 27th August 1920, published in the London Gazette of the 15th October 1920 (No. 32886), or arising out of any other available property, and it was by the said Rule provided that in any case where it is proved to the satisfaction of the Administrator that the claimant should have become aware only at a date subsequent to the 1st March 1923 of the existence or amount of a claim, the Administrator might extend the period for lodging the Proof of Claim with the Department until two calendar months after the claimant should have become aware of the existence and amount of the claim in question.

Now by way of variation of the proviso to the above mentioned Rule and in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Clearing Office and the Administrator as aforesaid, I hereby prescribe the 1st (first) day of March 1930 as the final date in the case of British nationals, whose claims come within the exception contained in the above mentioned proviso, by which proofs of debts due to them by Austrian nationals or of pecuniary obligations of the Austrian Government under Article 248 of the Treaty of St. Germain-en-Laye must be made upon the prescribed forms and lodged with the Department for the Administration of Austrian property in order to participate in the distribution of the funds in my hands arising out of the liquidation of the property rights and interests of nationals of the former Austrian Empire or otherwise as in the said Rule of the 5th (fifth) day of February 1923 particularly mentioned.
