LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT 1929, SECTION 25.

DISTRICT COUNCIL SCHEME.

The reconstituted County Council of the County of Lanark, in pursuance of the directions contained in Section 25 (1) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929, to prepare and submit to the Secretary of State for his approval a scheme therein called a "district council scheme," dividing the landward part of the County into districts in such manner that each district shall comprise one or more electoral divisions, do hereby make the following District Council Scheme for the County of Lanark:—

1. The landward part of the County of Lanark shall be divided into nine districts, numbered respectively one to nine, which shall be called the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, and Ninth Districts of the County of Lanark respectively.

2. The said districts shall respectively comprise the electoral divisions set forth in the first schedule annexed hereto.

3. The District Council for each district shall consist of the members of the County Council for each electoral division comprised in the district and of representatives for each electoral division comprised in the district to be elected in accordance with the provisions of Sub-sections (2) and (3) of Section 25 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929, as specified in the second schedule annexed hereto.
