ISSUE OF NEW CERTIFICATE.

The Scottish Education Department hereby give notice that they have issued a new Certificate under the Children Act, 1908, in respect of Gilshochill School, Glasgow, formerly known as Maryhill Industrial School for Girls.

The Certificate, which bears date 18th March 1930, provides that the number of children resident in the School at any one time, whether or not sent thereto in pursuance of the provisions of the Children Act, or of any other Act, shall not exceed one hundred and fifty, and is granted in respect of the admission of girls only.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS, 1920 TO 1929.

References to the High Court of Justice under Section 10 (1) (proviso ii) of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

Pursuant to paragraph 6 of the Unemployment Insurance (Determination of Questions) Regulations 1920, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice of her intention to refer to the High Court for decision the following questions that have arisen in applications made to her for her decision under Section 10 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, namely whether the employment of persons in the following circumstances is or is not employment within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920:—

Employment by a hospital as stoker.

Employment by H.M. Office of Works as "engineering attendant."

Under the Rules of the Supreme Court, Order LV B. Rule 28, any person who claims to be interested in or affected by the decisions to be given in the above mentioned cases may apply to the Judge for leave to intervene.

The cases have been set down in the High Court, and will be heard in the near future.
